SINGAPORE HOSTS 1ST ASIAN YOUTH GAMES

SINGAPORE is staging the first Asian Youth Games, an international multi-sports event which will be held every four years to complement the Asian Games.

The idea of staging it here was first mooted as part of Singapore's 2007 bid to host the Youth Olympic Games bid. On April 3 last year, the Olympic Council of Asia's Executive Board unanimously agreed to award the hosting of the first AYG to the Republic.

The decision was backed by all the council's 45 members on April 6 last year.

The inaugural Asian Youth Games is being co-organised by the Singapore Sports Council and the Ministry of Education.



The Games aims to gather athletes between 14 and 17 years old from around Asia in a celebration of youth, sports and learning. They will engage in friendly competition and imbibe the Olympic sporting values of excellence, friendship and respect.

The 2009 Games will see about 1,300 participants from 45 nations competing in 90 events across nine sports from June 29 to July 7. The sports are athletics, aquatics (diving and swimming), FIBA 33 (3-on-3), beach volleyball, bowling, football, sailing, shooting and table tennis.
